Surgery Discharge Instructions

Instructions after a SPAY:

Monitoring:

- 1. Please check the incision daily for signs of redness, swelling, discharge, or missing sutures.
- 2. If you pet stops eating, vomits, or becomes lethargic, please call BVH at 301-698-3330.
- 3. If you notice your pet licking or chewing the incision, please contact BVH for an Elizabethan collar.
- 4. Your pet may not swim or be bathed for 14 days or until the sutures are removed.
- 5. If skin sutures have been placed, please make an appointment in 10-14 days to have these removed.

Exercise:

- 1. For the first week after surgery, your pet should not run, jump, or play with other animals. Dogs should be walked on a leash.
- 2. After 10-14 days, your pet may return to normal activity.

Pain Medication: If the doctor has prescribed pain medication for your pet, please give according to label directions.

Instructions after a NEUTER:

Monitoring:

- 1. Your pet may still be a little sleepy tonight. Please keep them inside, and feed them just half of heir usual amount of food. Keep them away from stairs unless they are supervised.
- 2. Please check the incision and scrotum daily for signs of redness, swelling, discharge, or missing sutures.
- 3. If you pet stops eating, vomits, or becomes lethargic, please call BVH at 301-698-3330.
- 4. If you notice your pet licking or chewing the incision, please contact BVH for an Elizabethan collar.
- 5. Your pet may not swim or be bathed for 14 days or until the sutures are removed.
- 6. If skin sutures have been placed, please make an appointment in 10-14 days to have these removed.

Exercise:

- 1. Your pet may run and jump, but should not play roughly with other animals for 10-14 days.
- 2. Encourage exercise after day 2 at home to reduce scrotal swelling

Pain Medication: If the doctor has prescribed pain medication for your pet, please give according to label directions.

Instructions after a DECLAW:

Monitoring:

- 1. For the first 1-2 days, please watch carefully for any bleeding from the paws.
- 2. Please check the paws daily for any swelling or discharge. Your cat may be a little tender on its front feet for a few days, but if they will not bear weight on them, please call us.
- 3. If you pet stops eating, vomits, or becomes lethargic, please call BVH at 301-698-3330.
- 4. Please use Yesterdays News cat litter for the next 2 weeks to give the paws time to heal (NO clay or clumping litter!).

Exercise:

- 1. Please contain your cat to a small area or room for the first 2-3 days.
- 2. Do not allow your cat to jump on and off furniture or play roughly during healing.

Pain Medication: If the doctor has prescribed pain medication for your pet, please give according to label directions.
